# HELPING OUT

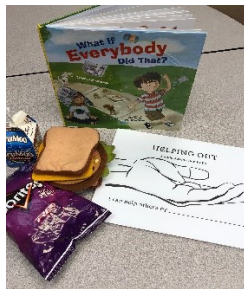
Question: Ask your children how they can help others and themselves.



HELPING HANDS ACROSS OUR HALLS –

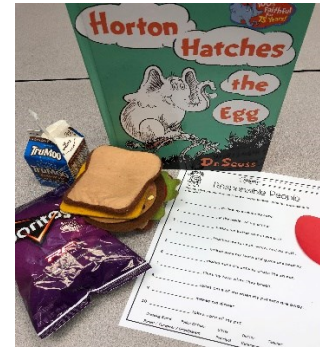
During April, we will be lining our halls with encouraging words about how we can help out.

## *PBIS Lessons: Grades K & 1*



During the K & 1<sup>st</sup> grade PBIS lessons, we read the book, ***What If Everybody Did That*** by Colleen Madden. This book teaches a valuable lesson about how each person's, everyday choices – good or bad – have consequences that are positive or negative. We spoke about how farmers bring food to our tables. If farmers decided to do something different, instead of their work, we would not have food to eat.

## *PBIS Lessons: Grades 2 & 3*



During the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> grade PBIS lessons, we read the book, ***Horton Hatches the Egg*** by Dr. Seuss. This book teaches a valuable lesson about how Horton helped out and took care of an abandon egg. We spoke about how Horton stayed faithful and helped until the end. We agreed that helping out shows good character.

## *PBIS Lessons: Grades 4 & 5*



During the 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> grade PBIS lessons, we completed a PowerPoint lesson called, ***Trustworthiness***. The PowerPoint helps students better understand why it is so important to be a person whom others can trust and rely on.
